# ITINERARY

Day 1: Board your overnight flight to Athens.

enjoy a farewell dinner with entertainment. (B,D)

Day 2: Arrival in Athens: Upon arrival you will be met by your tour manager and escorted to your deluxe motorcoach. Beginning your magical Greek experience as you make your way to your hotel which will be your home for the next seven nights. Tonight, enjoy a welcome dinner and reception as you get to know your fellow travellers. (D)

Day 3: Athens City Tour: Following breakfast, enjoy a stunning panoramic tour seeing Athens's most iconic landmarks, the Panathinaiko Stadium where the first Olympic Games of modern times took place in 1896. You will see Zappeion and Temple of Olympian Zeus, the Athens Trilogy which includes the University of Athens, the Academy of Athens, and the National Library. Continue passing by National Garden, Hadrian's Arch, St. Paul's Church, Parliament, Tomb of the Unknown soldier, Schliemann's House, Catholic Cathedral, Constitution Square, Russian Orthodox Church. Finally and sure to be a highlight, you will explore the Acropolis, built during the Golden Age. You will admire the Temple of Athena Nike, Parthenon, Erechtheion with its Porch of Maidens. Continue the pleasant short walk passing by Herodion and Dionysus Theater, to visit the Museum of Acropolis. This afternoon enjoy free time exploring the Plaka and admiring the Greek culture with the narrow streets full of old mansions. (B, L)

Day 4: Delphi (optional): Today is yours to enjoy at your leisure or you can join an optional tour to Delphi. Along the way, you will see the plain of Boeotia, an agricultural center. You will also pass by the city of Thebes, the birthplace of King Oedipus. You will see Castalia Spring, and the monument of the Argive Kings, the treasury of the Athenians, the Athenian Stoa, the Polygonal Wall, the monument of Platea and the Temple of Apollo famous for its oracle and Delphi museum. You will also visit cosmopolitan village of Arachova, the best winter resort of Greece. You can buy hand-made pastries, cheeses, spices, and many other local products or you can have lunch if you do not wish to do so in Delphi! (B)

Day 5: Ancient Sites & Mountainside Villages: Following breakfast this morning enjoy travelling back in time as you explore the Peloponnese Peninsula. You will make a short stop at the breathtaking Canal of Corinth with the amazing view of the 6km length and 80m height! Your next stop will be at Ancient Corinth to walk the same paths that the famous Apostle Paul walked. Continuing on you will be at the Ancient Mycenae, the center of Greek civilization. Visit the Cyclopean Walls, the famous Lion's Gate and the "Atreus King Tomb"! Our next stop is the seaside town of Nafplio. You can have a traditional Greek lunch here and then walk next to the coast, or you can visit the Castle of the Town, with the 999 steps and the amazing view. Afterwards, you will have our last stop at the Ancient Theatre of Epidaurus of the 15,000 spectators and the breathtaking acoustics. You will return to your hotel late in the afternoon. (B,L,D)

Day 6: Day Cruise to the island of Aegina (optional): Following breakfast enjoy a free day to see the local sites or take an optional day cruise to Aegina. You will embark on a ferry to reach the beautiful and traditional Island of Aegina.

Enjoy the Temple of Aphaia (or Afea) the temple of Aphaia (500-490 BC) which stands on a pine-clad hill in northeast Aegina. It is the most important monument in the sanctuary of Aphaia, which appears to have been founded on a site used for worship since the Mycenaean period. Your walking tour includes one of the popular Churches in Aegina, the Monastery of Agios Nektarios. It was founded and inaugurated on June 2, 1908 by Saint Nektarios. You will discover the main landmarks including the Kolona Archaeological site, the Cathedral, and the waterfront. As you explore, your guide sheds light on the history and culture of the island. Finally, you will reach the area of "Perdika", an old traditional settlement built around its harbor. The main feature of the settlement is the small houses with yards adjusted to each other. This afternoon enjoy your time on your own exploring Aegina. Be sure to take in a local delicious lunch with fresh fish and traditional Aegean dishes and snacks at the fish taverns and indulge in the pastry shops in front of the harbor and relax while enjoying the sea breeze. (B)

Day 7: Athens Food Tour: Today is sure to be a highlight as you take part in walking food tour in Athens starts from the central square of Athens. You will taste the traditionally brewed Greek coffee and will explore the famous district of Monastiraki with its popular Flea market. This neighborhood, in the old town of Athens, is one of the city's principal shopping districts and home to clothing boutiques, souvenir and specialty stores. Here you will have the chance to enjoy the Greek specialty, "loukoumades" (Greek donuts with honey syrup and almonds) and the delicious Greek souvlaki! (Small pieces of meat grilled on a skewer and served with pita bread, fried potatoes and lemon). You will continue our gourmet walking tour by visiting the old Central Market of Athens (Varvakios Agora), located in the heart of the city, and will learn from our guide some interesting facts about the city's culinary history. Next, you will visit specialty food stores to try local produce and cold cuts, you will discover some hidden stores to purchase fresh fruit, Greek olives, cheese, ham and other deli produce, local wine, aged aromatized vinegar, organic olive oil and honey. (B,L) 8: Day Cruise to the island of Hydra: Today you will enjoy a day cruise along the Argosaronic Gulf to the island of Hydra. Following breakfast you will take the ferry to the cosmopolitan island of Hydra depart. Hydra is one of the most romantic destinations in Greece, built on a slope overlooking the Argosaronic gulf. Here you will see the clearest water in the world. Car-free and protected by a preservation order, Hydra has always been the artists' muse of the Greek Islands. Traditional stone mansions, narrow cobblestoned streets, secluded squares and above all the banning of cars and the use of around 500 donkeys as means of public transportation, explain the reason why Hydra preserved its distinctive atmosphere through the passage of time. You can walk along the waterfront, the heart of the town, where you will encounter several monuments, churches, canons, museums, traditional mansions, statues of famous heroes, shops and cafes, while picturesque winding streets lead you to neighborhoods located at the upper part of the town. Later this afternoon we will take the ferry back to Piraeus port where our driver will meet you and transfer you to your hotel in Athens. Tonight,
